### STORM DRAIN ISSUES

Directors are exploring how best to manage our community's drainage system.

Weden Engineering, the civil engineering company who originally designed Sea Links' drainage system, was contacted to identify problems and develop a long-term maintenance plan. Directors Sandy Lahn, Curt Kinley and Claude Newton, met with a Weden representative on Tuesday, February 23rd, and toured the entire Sea Links drainage system, including inlets and outlets on the golf course.

Among the engineer's findings were pipe outlets and inlets full of water and covered in sediment, indicating possible blockages downstream as well as dense blackberry bushes and debris covering pipe outlets.

The goal of our Directors is to a 5 to 10 year maintenance plan which will resolve existing problems as soon as possible, to keep our drainage system working at top performance.

# ENGINEERED LANDSCAPING aka RAIN GARDENS COME TO SEA LINKS

Did you notice the rain garden at the newest home in our neighborhood at 7957 West Golf Course?

Have you ever thought of a natural drainage system or "engineered landscaping" to improve your yard?

A rain garden is a shallow depression, planted with deep-rooted native plants and grasses. The garden should be positioned near a runoff source like a downspout, driveway or sump pump to capture rainwater runoff and stop the water from reaching the sewer system.

Usually it is designed to withstand the extremes of moisture and concentrations of nutrients, particularly Nitrogen and Phosphorus, found in stormwater runoff.
